The habitat surveys carried out by volunteers, this spring, continue to throw up potentials schemes for improvement. This picture on the right may look like "Pig Heaven" but allowing then to paddle directly into the stream results in toxic run off during wet weather and this noticeably reduced the water quality immediately downstream, where much lower invertebrate levels were found. Fencing the stream and providing an alternative water supply would improve water quality and fish numbers.
